

**NOBLE HIGH SCHOOL STUDENT-ATHLETE NAMED
GATORADE OKLAHOMA GIRLS SOCCER PLAYER OF THE YEAR**

CHICAGO (June, 23, 2022) — In its 37th year of honoring the nation's best high school athletes, Gatorade today announced **Samantha Allen** of **Noble High School** is the **2021-22 Gatorade Oklahoma Girls Soccer Player of the Year**. Allen is the first Gatorade Oklahoma Girls Soccer Player of the Year to be chosen from Noble High School.

The award, which recognizes not only outstanding athletic excellence, but also high standards of academic achievement and exemplary character demonstrated on and off the field, distinguishes Allen as Oklahoma's best high school girls soccer player. Now a finalist for the prestigious Gatorade National Girls Soccer Player of the Year award to be announced in June, Allen joins an elite alumni association of state award-winners in 12 sports, including Alexi Lalas (1987-88, Cranbrook High School, Mich.), Steve Cherundolo (1996-97, Mt. Carmel High School, Calif.), Abby Wambach (1997-98, Our Lady of Mercy School of Young Women, N.Y.), Heather O'Reilly (2001-02 & 2002-03, East Brunswick High School, N.J.), Matt Besler (2004-05, Blue Valley West High School, Kans.), Jack Harrison (2013-14, Berkshire High School, Mass.) and Mallory Pugh (2014-15, Mountain Vista High School, Colo.).

The 5-foot-6 senior forward scored 56 goals and passed for 15 assists this past season, leading the Bears (12-2) to the Class 5A quarterfinals. Allen is an All-State honoree and a three-time All-District selection. She concluded her prep career with 169 goals, which is widely held to be the most in state history.

Allen has volunteered locally on behalf of the Special Olympics and the Christmas Store of Cleveland County, a shopping opportunity for low-income persons who wish to create a meaningful holiday season for their families. "We played against a lot of quality teams this year, and Samantha Allen was incredible," said Brad Brucker, head coach at Piedmont High School. "She's quick and powerful, and a very strong shooter with both feet. She's deadly if you give her any room at all."

Allen has maintained a 3.77 GPA in the classroom. She has signed a National Letter of Intent to play soccer on scholarship at Oklahoma State University this fall.

The [Gatorade Player of the Year](#) program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by the Gatorade Player of the Year Selection Committee, which leverages experts including coaches, scouts, media and others as sources to help evaluate and determine the state winners in each sport.

Allen joins recent Gatorade Oklahoma Girls Soccer Players of the Year Makenzie Malham (2020-21, Union High School), Madison Tokarchik (2019-20, Bishop Kelley High School), and Ashton Gordon (2018-19 & 2017-18, Booker T. Washington High School), among the state's list of former award winners.

Gatorade has a long-standing history of serving athlete communities and understands how sports instill valuable lifelong skills on and off the field. Through Gatorade's "Play it Forward" platform, Allen has the opportunity to award a \$1,000 grant to a local or national organization of their choosing that helps young athletes realize the benefits of playing sports. Allen is also eligible to submit a short video explaining why the organization they chose is deserving of one of twelve \$10,000 spotlight grants, which will be announced throughout the year. To date, Gatorade Player of the Year winners' grants have totaled more than \$3.5 million across more than 1,300 organizations.

Since the program's inception in 1985, Gatorade Player of the Year award recipients have won hundreds of professional and college championships, and many have also turned into pillars in their communities, becoming coaches, business owners and educators.
