BRANDON VALLEY HIGH SCHOOL STUDENT-ATHLETE NAMED GATORADE SOUTH DAKOTA GIRLS SOCCER PLAYER OF THE YEAR

CHICAGO (June, 23, 2022) — In its 37th year of honoring the nation's best high school athletes, Gatorade today announced **Tyreese Zacher** of **Brandon Valley High School** is the **2021-22 Gatorade South Dakota Girls Soccer Player of the Year**. Zacher is the first Gatorade South Dakota Girls Soccer Player of the Year to be chosen from Brandon Valley High School.

The award, which recognizes not only outstanding athletic excellence, but also high standards of academic achievement and exemplary character demonstrated on and off the field, distinguishes Zacher as South Dakota's best high school girls soccer player. Now a finalist for the prestigious Gatorade National Girls Soccer Player of the Year award to be announced in June, Zacher joins an elite alumni association of state award-winners in 12 sports, including Alexi Lalas (1987-88, Cranbrook High School, Mich.), Steve Cherundolo (1996-97, Mt. Carmel High School, Calif.), Abby Wambach (1997-98, Our Lady of Mercy School of Young Women, N.Y.), Heather O'Reilly (2001-02 & 2002-03, East Brunswick High School, N.J.), Matt Besler (2004-05, Blue Valley West High School, Kans.), Jack Harrison (2013-14, Berkshire High School, Mass.) and Mallory Pugh (2014-15, Mountain Vista High School, Colo.).

The 5-foot-7 junior defender anchored a back line that helped register eight shutouts, leading the Lynx (12-2-1) to the Class AA state semifinals. Zacher also contributed two goals and four assists on offense. A two-time First Team All-State selection, she is a member of the U.S. Youth Soccer Olympic Development Program Region II team.

Zacher has volunteered locally as a youth soccer coach and referee, and she has donated her time to multiple community service initiatives through her church youth group. "Tyreese was a beast to get past defensively and, oftentimes, found herself in the attack as well," said Sheila Diercks, head coach of O'Gorman High sCHOOL. "She was a dangerous player."

Zacher has maintained a 3.47 GPA in the classroom. She will begin her senior year of high school this fall.

The <u>Gatorade Player of the Year</u> program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by the Gatorade Player of the Year Selection Committee, which leverages experts including coaches, scouts, media and others as sources to help evaluate and determine the state winners in each sport.

Zacher joins recent Gatorade South Dakota Girls Soccer Players of the Year Megan Fastenau (2020-21, Aberdeen Central High School), Jaiden Boomsma (2019-20, Yankton High School), Lexie Wood (2018-19, Stevens High School), and Joana Zanin (2017-18, T.F. Riggs High School), among the state's list of former award winners.

Gatorade has a long-standing history of serving athlete communities and understands how sports instill valuable lifelong skills on and off the field. Through Gatorade's "Play it Forward" platform, Zacher has the opportunity to award a \$1,000 grant to a local or national organization of their choosing that helps young athletes realize the benefits of playing sports. Zacher is also eligible to submit a short video explaining why the organization they chose is deserving of one of twelve \$10,000 spotlight grants, which will be announced throughout the year. To date, Gatorade Player of the Year winners' grants have totaled more than \$3.5 million across more than 1,300 organizations.

Since the program's inception in 1985, Gatorade Player of the Year award recipients have won hundreds of professional and college championships, and many have also turned into pillars in their communities, becoming coaches, business owners and educators.
